#### **Hurricane Season Is Approaching**

Waiting until the last moment could have dire consequences. According to forecasters, this hurricane season could be one of the most active on record.

#### **Jefferson Parish Is Ready**

We have reviewed and updated our emergency plans and have assigned and trained essential personnel for their duties. Our Emergency Management Team has conducted a series of table-top exercises, shelter training and **Emergency Operations Center** activation training. Since Hurricane Ida, we have altered our plans to better address storms that are intensifying with little warning.

#### **Editor's Notes**

### What's in Your Hurricane Wallet?

You may know that the commercial asking, "What's in your wallet?" refers to a credit card, but the headline here refers to something more important. Do you have an emergency stash of cash?

More than likely you have heard predictions of an active hurricane season this year. And if you have lived here a while, you probably can recite by heart annual reminders to maintain your emergency kit (batteries, flashlights, non-perishable foods, first aid kits, etc.). But reminders to be financially prepared for disasters and other emergencies get much less air time.

If you answered "zero" to the first question of this article and "no" to the second, then why not consider the benefits of an emergency cash stash now?

I know that saving money and planning for disasters can be difficult. Thinking about it may even spark anxiety, but would finding yourself in a disaster without an emergency fund spark even more anxiety?

Ready.gov calls an emergency stash an Emergency Financial First Aid Kit, EFFAK, and advises us to stock it with more than money. For example, they advise having critical personal documents (copies of official photo IDs for household members; adoption records, birth certificates, medical information); contact information for friends, family, and your employer; and insurance policies (life, homeowners, renters, flood and auto). Good advice.

Let's talk about the money. First, develop the habit of keeping small amounts of cash at

home, particularly small bills because ATMs and credit cards may not work during disasters. Now, here are tips for building an emergency fund:

- 1. Determine how much you need in your fund.
- 2. Set a goal based on the amount you need.
- 3. Have a separate savings account designated for emergencies.
- 4. Automate your savings: have a set amount sent to your emergency account from each paycheck.
- 5. Save your change/coins. Do you have a piggy bank or water jug filled with coins? Cash it in and jump start your savings.
- 6. Cut back on your expenses. Maybe you have annual subscriptions to streaming services and products you do not need: find them and unsubscribe. Pay off a debt, eat out less or minimize spending on other non-essential items/activities. Then send the money you save in those areas to your emergency fund.
- 7. Finally, and possibly most important, set it and forget it. Let your emergency fund grow!

I hope that we are not affected by a hurricane this season, but if we are I am confident that we can all be prepared. Be safe, be ready, and start saving!

#### **Hurricane Season**

Hurricane season is upon us once again. Hurricane season officially begins on June 1st and ends on November 30th. The hurricane names for this year are as follows: Alberto, Beryl, Chris, Debby, Ernesto, Francine, Gordon, Helene, Isaac, Joyce, Kirk, Leslie, Milton, Nadine, Oscar, Patty, Rafael, Sara, Tony, Valerie and William.

#### **GOHSEP**

Jefferson is one of three parishes that participated in GOHSEP's three-day statewide exercise in mid-April. The purpose of the exercise was to train with our regional partners on a hurricane making landfall near SELA. On each day we practiced a different phase of emergency management.

On day one JPEM conducted a tabletop exercise to practice evacuation decisions. On day two we conducted the annual EOC Activation Training in conjunction with the statewide exercise. Injects were called by team members into our telephone operations, which were then tasked to assigned ESFs/LNOs. Situational reports and JP requests were sent to the State for assistance. JPEM is prepared for a far above-normal hurricane season. We want citizens to make sure they are ready too and have a plan in place before a storm threatens the area.



Jefferson Parish Emergency Management members Joe Valiente, Claire Ward, and Kyle **Baudoin** attended the National Hurricane Conference in Orlando, Florida, in March. During the conference the team attended sessions on new and emerging technology for increasing disaster preparedness, federal grant programs, strategic-level operations during hurricane response, sheltering, and panels hosted by hurricane experts. The team also attended multiple networking events hosted by Juvare, DRC, and Rave to bring better monitoring and emergency communication for the residents of Jefferson Parish.

Four staff members (Joe Valiente, Dustin Guidroz, Jay Dugas, and Jeremy Guillot) also attended the Louisiana Emergency Management Conference in Lake Charles. The conference included education, outreach and training tailored to the needs of federal, state and local government, specifically pertaining to homeland security, emergency preparedness, disaster recovery and mitigation activities.

The Eastbank recycling drop-off location is currently in the parking lot of the Joseph S. Yenni Building (1221 Elmwood Park Boulevard, Jefferson, LA 70123) but is subject to change. Please monitor our Recycling webpage for any updates.

This program is open to all Jefferson Parish citizens. Residents are encouraged to sort their recycling by type and make sure that it is clean. Representatives from REALCYCLE and Glass Half Full educate the public and assist them with the sorting process. The events so far have been very popular, with an average turnout of 300 vehicles per week on the Eastbank and 100 on the Westbank. The Environmental Affairs Department would like to thank General Services, Security, the Public Information Office, and the Jefferson Parish

Sheriff's Office for their contributions that help make these events possible.

Household Hazardous Materials (HHM) are leftover household products that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable or reactive ingredients. Products such as paints, common household cleaners, oils, batteries and pesticides that contain potentially hazardous ingredients require special care when disposed. The improper disposal

of HHM can include pouring waste down the drain, into storm drains, or, in some cases, putting it out with the trash. The dangers of such disposal methods might not be immediately obvious, but improper disposal pollutes the environment and may pose a threat to human health.

The Department of Environmental Affairs will host a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event on Saturday, June 8th, from 9 a.m. to noon at the John A. Alario Event Center. Jefferson Parish Environmental Affairs will work with Legacy Environmental, Jefferson Parish Sheriff's office, and Jefferson Parish Departments of Security, General Services, Alario Center, Recreation, and Public Information Office to put on another great event that will serve the public in an efficient and safe manner. Mercury-containing equipment, paint, lawn and garden products, household cleaning products and chemicals, lighting components, electronic waste, small arms ammunition, pyrotechnics, and safety equipment will be collected. As a state and national Keep America Beautiful affiliate, this event will showcase the Parish's continued commitment to reducing litter and assisting the community with proper disposal of all types of waste.


We are very proud of their 70 years of experience, which provides our department with a broad base of knowledge. We thank them for their dedicated service.

#### Hurrah for the North Kenner Library

She called them 'The Dream Team.'"

#### Regional Premiere of Long-Lost Bogdanovich Comedy Movie Slated for Eastbank Regional Library

Squirrels to the Nuts, the final motion picture directed by Peter Bogdanovich--and only recently rediscovered--was screened at on May 29 at the East Bank Regional Library, 4747 W. Napoleon, Metairie. The program was free of charge and open to the public.

A substantially revised version of the film was released in 2014 as *She's Funny That Way*. It was heavily cut, reshot, and burdened with a voice-over narration. The director's cut was thought to have vanished until a high-definition video master was discovered on eBay by James Kenney, a Bogdanovich fan and instructor of English at City University of New York (CUNY) who is under contract to write a biography of the renowned filmmaker.

Starring Owen Wilson, Imogen Poots, and Kathryn Hahn, *Squirrels to the Nuts* is a raucous screwball comedy in the vein of *What's Up, Doc?* (1972), a last hurrah for a filmmaker obsessed with human foibles and the complications that arise from them. In the film, a married Broadway director falls for a call-girl-turned-actress and works to help her ad-

vance her career, but the plot becomes more complicated.

Kenney spoke in advance of the screening and a Q&A was held at the conclusion of the film. He describes *Squirrels* as "a rich and delightful summation of Bogdanovich's style and obsessions, featuring surprising depth of characterization and expertly executed comic set pieces." Though it was screened only three times, Bogdanovich called *Squirrels* "one of my best pictures."

This program was organized by Nicholas Caluda, a librarian at the West Bank Regional Library who has organized an ongoing film series at that branch location.

Planning congratulates Administrative Assistant, **Katina Webb**, our department's 2024 Employee of the Year. From purging old department cases to planning the next big office party and every-



#### **Hurricane Season Preparedness**

Since hurricane season is almost upon us, please ensure that your department reviews its contracts and is prepared. Preplanning is essential to successfully navigate and overcome an emergency event. In order for the Parish to request and receive full reimbursement from FEMA, departments must maintain accurate and thorough records and documentation related to the emergency event. This includes all purchases made in anticipation of, during, and after the emergency event. Each department should have an Emergency Event Preparedness and Response Plan (Plan) in place including specific procedures pertaining to emergency purchases.

Departments should utilize the Purchasing Department's Emergency Procurement Manual for all emergency purchases related to federal, state, and local disasters. The Manual focuses on the emergency procurement process before, during, and after an emergency event. It also includes relevant forms that are required for emergency procurement. Visit the Purchasing Department's "Reference Material" section of the JeffConnect intranet portal to access the Manual.
